



High School Transition:

With 15 of our senior students due to move to High School in 2015, transition planning is well underway. Students taking part in group transition programs will have already received information about these sessions, the dates of which also appear at the start of this newsletter. Four students will be taking part in separate, flexible transition sessions which better suit their individual needs. As well as supporting visits to their new schools, work is also being done at Creaney to prepare each student for the expectations of high school. This is an exciting time for all the students and their families but as with any big change, can also be associated with worry and apprehension.
