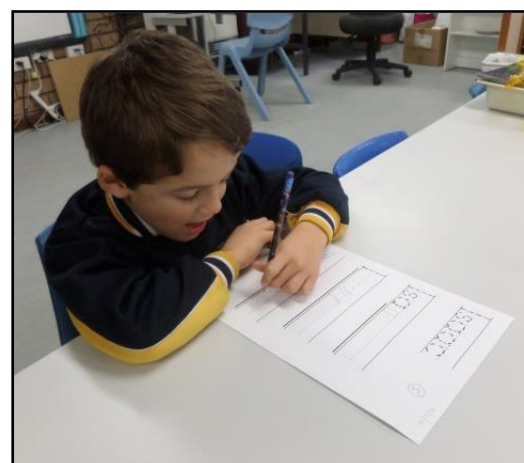

Most of the students have successfully completed their Independent work folders during this term. Next term they will be enjoying exciting new work as well as the introduction of more group and cooperative work sessions.

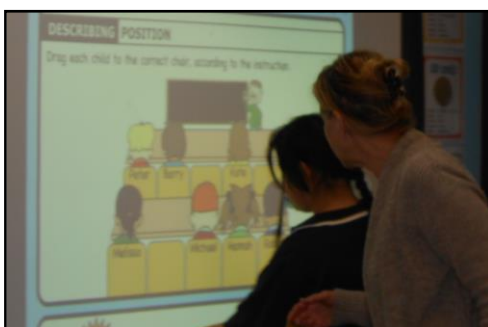
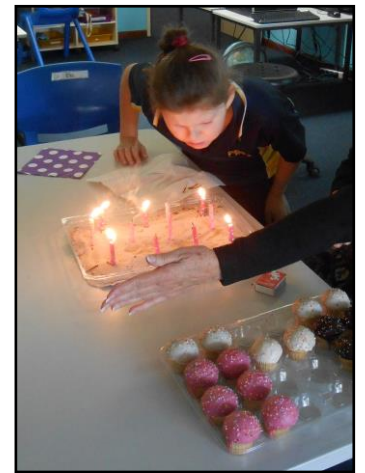
There have been three student birthdays this term. Happy Birthday to Ella, Isaia and Jayme.

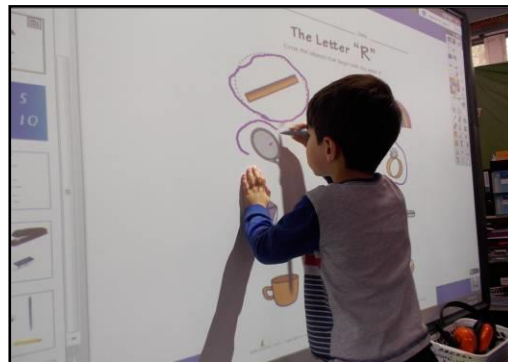

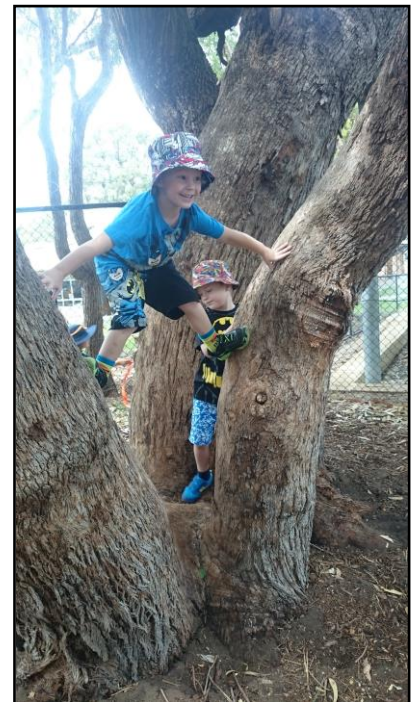
