Kambarang

Kambarang is the season from October to November. It is the wildflower season. The yellows of many of the Acacias continue to abound, along with some of the Banksias and many other smaller delicate flowering plants including the Kangaroo Paw and Orchids. One of the most striking displays of flowers to be seen during this season will be the "Mooja", or Australian Christmas Tree (Nuytsia). The bright orange/yellow flowers serve to signal the heat is on its way. These are months of long, dry days. The people moved back to the coast. Food was caught by hunting for fish and water birds and their eggs. They also ate plant life, fruit, berries and yams. They collected tubers of orchids and ate them cooked or raw.
