Embedding The Early Years Learning Framework In Kindy Room 4


At Creaney ESC, the Early Years Learning Framework for Australia, underpins everything we do!
Fundamental to the Framework is a view of children's lives as characterised by:
"Belonging, being and becoming".



Starting school for the first time is big! We spend our time building relationships, getting to know our students and families, and helping them to feel safe, supported, and happy to come to school each day. How do we do this? Here is a snapshot showing some of our kindy experiences.



Belonging – "In early childhood, and throughout life, trusting relationships and affirming experiences are crucial to a sense of belonging". In Kindy, we set the routines and structures at school. We are learning to be part of a bigger group, take turns and share and are getting to know the people, locations, and activities at school.



Being – "Childhood is a time to be, to seek and make meaning of the world." With a play-based focus on learning, we engage with our world more readily and naturally learn by 'doing'. We play spontaneously by following the students' lead and by setting up structured opportunities to scaffold play and social skills and intentionally teach ways to use play equipment. Knowing our students' interests helps us set up relevant and engaging experiences that we know they will love!

Becoming – "...reflects the process of rapid and significant change that occurs in the early years as children learn and grow". We are building fine and gross motor skills, fostering independence, embedding life skills, communication, emotional regulation, and social skills at every opportunity throughout each school day.
