
### **WAESSPA Awards Night**

School Bus Services have started to receive applications for the 2026 school year. We encourage families to submit applications **before 14 November 2025** in order to save a seat for 2026. Applications received after this date may be delayed, which may affect allocation onto a bus in time for the commencement of Term 1, 2026.

Note that families do not need to reapply if there are no changes to their current circumstances and they are currently receiving transport assistance via bus or conveyance allowance





Please note:

- Each student is required to apply for school bus services using the online application form.
- Families with multiple students can submit one online form by selecting "add" for each student.
- If a student's school or residential address does not change, do not reapply each year.
- If a student changes schools or moves to a new residential address, a new Transport Assistance application is to be submitted for that student.
- Transport Assistance applications should be submitted no later than November for the following year and can be submitted up to 12 months in advance.
