Game Play

All players bat and field in every inning, no one sits off. Each player has a buddy that supports them throughout the game, with batting and fielding. No scores are kept, players receive balls tossed by a coach or hit off a tee when batting. There are no outs, and every player moves around the bases.

Games are played at Wanneroo Giants Baseball Club, Kingsway Sporting Complex, Madeley on Saturday mornings 8.30am - 9.30am. The season runs from October to March, with a break over the summer school holidays.

Djilba

Djilba is the season from August to September. It is the time of the second rains. During this season, the days begin to become warmer and the nights are still cooler, but the rain is slowing. The people collected plant roots and hunted emu, kangaroo, possums and bandicoot. This is the start of the massive flowering explosion that happens in the South West. This starts with the yellow flowering plants such as the Acacias. Also colours that are around at this time of year are creams, combined with some vivid and striking blues.
